Parking/drop off and pick up

This will likely be a monthly reminder as in the past, drop off and pick up can get a bit troublesome. The good news is we can all work together to keep all our kids safe at drop off and pick up times.

Please drive slowly. Please do NOT park where there are **plyons**, and do not go into the staff parking lot. Do not park along the field fence where it is clearly marked bus zone.

You can drop off and pick up from the side streets and **use the cross walk** to cross 309th ave to the school. Thank you for working together to keep traffic moving smoothly and most of all for keeping our students safe.

Please remember all students will be brought into the school in the morning by their teacher and they will meet the students outside. The older students will begin to meet their teacher at their assigned door in the mornings, but the younger students will continue to be picked up at their meeting spot. Kids and parents **do not come into the school** before the bell to wait for school. We need to reduce the number of people in our hallways both for our communicable disease plan and for fire safety.

Bus Students/Other People Picking Up Students

Please let the office or the supervisor on bus duty know if you are taking your child at the end of the day or have any change of plans for students taking the bus. We have a bus attendance list for students and if we can't find them we search the school for them and hold the bus. Also we need to know if there is someone else, other than parents, picking up your child. Thank you for supporting our student safety protocol.

Please remind your child(ren) that if their parent or caregiver isn't there to pick them up after school they should come back into the school and we will contact the appropriate person.

Forms

This year we have started a new program for completing school forms using CLEVR. This online forms site will help with easier completion of all important school information and permission forms throughout the year. You will have received emails and information already with instructions on how to sign in to your account.

The Student Verification form that is on CLEVR needs to be verified, and complete any information that has changed or is missing please.

There have also been a few paper forms sent home. Please be sure to complete all of these forms as soon as possible. The information this gives us here at school is important for your childs safety.

Medical Alert

Please be sure to complete the Medical form with any pertinent information and if your child's medical condition has changed. This form is available on the new CLEVR program. Please let the office know if there are any changes throughout the year (allergies, Epi pens etcetera). If your child requires an epipen, please send one to keep at the school.

Student Fees

All fees this year will be processed through a new program called SchoolCash Online. This will give families the opportunity to complete transactions from anywhere with ease. You have received information regarding this new program already, but please don't hesitate to contact Shannon Portman if you have any questions. We are no longer able to accept etransfers.

Fire Drills and Lock Down Practice

Section 31(h) of the *Fire Services Act* requires that a system of fire drills approved by the Fire Commissioner, be adopted and practised by all persons in every school, and that the Fire Commissioner has approved a fire drill system that consists of total evacuation fire drills held at least three times in each of the fall and spring school terms.

British Columbia's Ministry of Education also requires that schools have an *Emergency Management Plan* to keep students, teachers and staff safe in any emergency, disaster or tragic event, be it natural disasters, human-caused events or technological and biological hazards. The plan takes an all-hazards approach, focusing on a small number of responses that can be used in a variety of situations. The responses we practice are lockdowns, hold & secure and Fire Drills. We will practice our first Fire Drill in September. If you would like more information, please contact Stacy DeCosse at Marysville.

Support for Student Activities

We would like to remind parents that at Marysville, no child will be unable to participate in activities due to financial reasons. The PAC and the school have funds available to assist families in this regard. Please contact Stacy DeCosse or talk with your child's teacher if this is a concern for your family.

Parent Suggestions or Concerns

It has a been a great start-up this year and we appreciate everyone working together to make things go as smoothly as possible. We strive to do our best but unfortunately, "glitches" do crop up in the course of a school year and we may be unaware there is a problem until someone brings it to our attention. Please help us by contacting the office or your child's teacher if you have any questions or suggestions. Call Stacy DeCosse anytime to air concerns or ask questions. Thanks!

Juice Boxes

We ask parents to use refillable water bottles filled with water rather than send juice boxes to school. A water bottle is better for the environment, which is of course a great message to model for children. Juice boxes often contribute to waste, mess and spills in classrooms because the residual juice in the bottom of juice boxes leaks out. This creates a sticky mess in the bottom of our recycling boxes and makes floor and desk clean up a sticky affair. Thank you in advance for your support.

Birthday Invitations

We kindly ask that children do not extend birthday invitations at school as this can cause hurt feelings for those who are not invited. Instead, please give the invitations to the classroom teacher who will then subtly put invitations into backpacks. We ask that we continue to NOT send any food (cupcakes, treats etc.) for celebrations at school this year.

Toys from Home

We ask that your child please leave all electronic devices, toys and cards (cars, Pokemon/hockey cards, stuffed animals, etc.) at home as it creates problems in the classroom and the playground. Thank you.

Nut Free School

At Marysville School some children are severely allergic to nut products including peanut butter and these allergies can be life threatening. This medical condition is called anaphylaxis. Even a tiny bit can be fatal within minutes. Touching another student's desk that has a trace of the allergen (nuts, nut products or dairy) can cause this reaction. Please do not send products with nuts, peanut butter or trace products with your child to school.
